Father Liam says: Parliament has not been sitting for quite a while now. How would you feel if it were to meet and conduct business on Christmas Day? That is what happened in this country a mere 375 years ago. Oliver Cromwell led a revolt resulting in the Civil War and the execution of King Charles I on 30th January 1649. As Christmas celebrations were not mentioned in the Bible, Cromwell and his Parliament decided to abolish them. The first attack on Christmas took place in September 1642 when the largely Puritan Parliament outlawed the performance of plays, including Christmas Pageants. They viewed Christmas festivities as the trappings of 'Popery'.

In September 1643 the Puritans abolished the Feast of Christmas and decreed that it was to be observed as a normal day. Hence Parliament was summoned to sit on Christmas Day 1644. Preaching to the House of Lords on that day Edmund Calamy declared: 'This day is commonly called the Feast of Christ's Nativity, or Christmas Day, a day that has formerly been much abused to superstition and profaneness. This year God, by his providence, has buried this Feast in a Fast and I hope it will never rise again.'

The excesses of the Tudor era had been replaced by severe intolerance of any celebration of Christmas. Widespread riots and civil disobedience followed and eventually Christmas slowly began to re-emerge. So, unfortunately, did the excesses.
