**FATHER LIAM SAYS:** Early in lockdown Pope Francis appointed a Vatican Commission to consult experts across the world on the post-Covid future. He asked the Commission to 'prepare the future'. He wanted the Church not just to respond to what was to come but to help shape it. Now that the world had entered a dark night, Pope Francis has been in a sense, the world's spiritual director. Of course when Jesus said to Simon 'You are the rock' he was not just speaking to the man Simon. He had in mind those who would follow him in guiding the Christian family. Pope Francis did not allow himself to be overwhelmed by the severity of the pandemic. He summoned the energy and creativity to shine a torch on the paths ahead.

He wrote a delightful book called 'Let us Dream – the Path to a Better Future'. It ends with a poem which he received from a friend in Argentina. It was written by a Cuban actor and comedian in Miami, Alexis Valdes. He wrote it in Spanish in a single sitting, without changing the words, as if God had used him as a channel. Pope Francis says of it: 'It captures the path to a better future that I have tried to express in this book. Let's let his poetry and its beauty have the final word'.
