**FATHER LIAM SAYS:** The Gospel for the Feast of the Holy Family this year tells you of the finding of Jesus in the Temple when he was twelve years old. It may seem a bit strange to be celebrating the birth of Jesus one day and the following day to meet him almost as a teenager. In the next two years this feast will have a much younger Jesus featured in the gospel and several days will separate the two Feasts.

The Gospel of the Feast today is about the re-uniting of the Holy Family after Mary and Joseph had discovered that the boy Jesus was not with either of them. Luke – the only gospel writer who tells us about it - makes it clear how upset Mary and Joseph were about the incident. Mary says to the Boy: 'My child, why have you done this to us? See how worried your father and I have been, looking for you.' It is every parent's nightmare! Luke does not tell us what Joseph said, but we can be sure he had something to say! But none of the gospel writers tell us a single word that Joseph ever said. Matthew tells quite a bit about Joseph in his gospel – how the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, telling him not to be afraid to take Mary to his home as his wife. Joseph is told by the angel that Mary had conceived by the Holy Spirit 'the one who will save his people from their sins'. Moreover, Joseph is told that he must name the child Jesus. By naming the child Joseph became in Jewish las his legal father. Joseph was a decedent of King David. Jesus was therefore able to be called 'Son of David'. The Messiah, of course, had to come from David's line. Matthew goes on to tell us how Joseph guides his wife and child out of danger's way and eventually brought them to Nazareth when herod was no longer a threat.

But at no time do we actually hear from Joseph. We would surely like to reflect on some words of his. But the gospels were not written to satisfy our curiosity but 'were written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God and that believing this you may have life in his name'. (John 20:31)

When we started planning how to celebrate the Golden Jubilee of our church there were a number of Parish Meetings to discuss how we might fittingly go about it. One of the decisions we arrived at was to commission a wooden image of St Joseph to compliment the beautiful carved image of Mary and the child Jesus. The company who had produced that statue were approached and they agreed to furnish us with a matching statue of St Joseph. They are the same company who designed the Martyrs Window in our church. Within weeks of the celebration of the Golden jubilee the pandemic struck. Eventually the statue of Mary and the Child was brought to their workshop in Lancashire to ensure that the statue of St Joseph would blend well. An added consideration in deciding to have a new statue of St Joseph is that Pope Francis decided that the year 2021 would be thew year of St Joseph. It was only in the last week or so that it was completed and that they could bring the statue down and put them in place.

What a joy that they are now with us just in time for Christmas and the Feat of the Holy Family. We ask St Joseph, who protected the child Jesus, to inspire us to protect one another and to protect the environment – our common home.
