FATHER LIAM SAYS: I recently wrote a note in the Newsletter about Father Albert Purdie who served as a Chaplain in the First World War and was awarded an OBE for bravery. Much later he retired to Goring where he died in 1976 at the age of 88. there are copies of the booklet about him, giving a number of poems he wrote at the Front. A parishioner here has fond memories of him from her First Holy Communion days when he was helping Canon McCarthy. Below are two of his poems from Christmas 1915 and Christmas 1916.

Christmas 1915

Babe of the stable cold and bare, Babe of the winter night, Babe of the snow and freezing air -(And Joseph had no brazier there, And only a candle light) -Poor wee little might!

Out o' the East a star aflare Clomb up in the silent sky, And wonderingly it tarried where in tumbled straw the baby fair Mary had put to lie With the oxen nigh. Lo, on the hills a flash of wings And the sudden stir of a song: 'To men of goodwill this infant brings Store of peace and good tidings!' (And what if the war be long, Were the angels wrong?)

Kings from afar with gifts of gold, Of myrrh, and of incense sweet, Came with the star to the stable cold And saw the Child by Writ foretold, And with honour meet Knelt down at His feet.

Christmas 1916 (Picardy)

O little Jesus look at me
Observing Thy nativity!
See, on this Christmas Eve I lie
On straw in a broken barn; on high
Star-shells bright
With a trail of light
Gleam in the Eastern sky!
And when I shepherd my thoughts at night,
Angels come to my darkened sight
And sing, when the noises of war are still:
'Peace on earth to men of good will -

Peace to the hearts from evil free,
That love both friend and enemy!'
You know I cherish no lust to kill,
But only my life to give
That others might live.
Alas, the Kings of the earth proffer
To Thee and Thy people only myrrh:
But look, dear Child, I give to You
The gold of a heart untarnished and true,
And the fragrant spice
Of my sacrifice!
