**FATHER LIAM SAYS: Today's Feast of St Peter and St Paul** reminds us that we share the same faith that they did. We celebrate the same Eucharist that they celebrated. We belong to the same family of Christ that they gloried in. The Church is truly remarkable. No other institution in our world today has had a larger continuous history. It is a rich and complex history. It stretches across every culture from the ancient Greek speaking world centred in the Mediterranean to today's post modern world. It embraces all languages, ancient and modern and embodies a multitude of styles in art and architecture. Its members have been great saints and great sinners. It has survived severe persecutions and horrible scandals. Throughout two thousand years it has periods of growth and of decline. Where once it was strong it is sometimes now few in numbers and in other places it enjoys new vigour.

The Church is Christ's family. It is founded by him and strengthened by him. He promised to be with his Church – with us – to the end of time. He established the Church to continue his ministry throughout time and throughout the world. This is the unchanging and unchangeable task Christ has given us. And he has equipped us for that task. It is a noble and privileged task to bear witness to Christ in the world. To continue this work, the Church is always in need of being healed and restored.

Pope Francis has been assiduous in his efforts to renew the Church. In his first interview as Pope in September 2013 he said: 'We must walk together – the people, the bishops and the Pope. Synodality should be lived at various levels.' The word 'synod' literally means 'journeying together'. The synodal journey initiated by Pope Francis reaches a major milestone in October. The second part of the General Assembly of the Synod takes place in Rome from the 2<sup>nd</sup> to the 27<sup>th</sup> of that month. The first part took place last October. There will be – as last October – a large number of non-ordained people, among them over fifty women taking part as voting participants. They will have at their disposal the feedback from around the world to the Report from the first phase of the Synod, last year. There will also be the initial findings from ten study groups set up by the Pope to reflect on various issues discussed last year. Among these are some canonical matters regarding specific ministerial forms which may include consideration of the female diaconate. Also up for discussion will be 'theological criteria and synod methodologies for shared discernment of controversial doctrinal, pastoral and ethical issues.'

From all over the world, with subtle difference of emphasis, the role of women in the Church has emerged as a pressing issue. There have been significant conversations in Rome over the past several months, including dialogue between women theologians and Pope Francis with his Council of Cardinals. Again and again the Pope has called for a 'de-masculinisation of the Catholic Church'.

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#### **Words from Pope Francis:**

'Perfect families do not exist. This must not discourage us. Quite the opposite. Love is something we learn. Love is something we live. Love grows as it is formed by the concrete situations which each particular family experiences. Love is born and constantly develops amid lights and shadows.

Love is shown by little things, by attention to small daily signs which make us feel at home. Faith grows when it is lived and shaped by love. That is why our families, our homes, are true domestic churches'.
