Father Liam says: There are two books that tell us about the mystery of life. The first book is the book of nature – the book of the natural world. What a treasure trove the world of nature is – the sun, the moon, the stars, the skies, the earth and everything in it that lives – trees, flowers, grasses, plants of every kind, animals, birds, fish, flies, insects, the air we breathe, the water we drink, mountains, hills, valleys, rivers, seas – the list goes on. How did all these things come into being? Who has filled all the chapters of this wonderful book of nature with so many mysteries?

People have been pondering this amazing and massive universe ever since they have become part of it. The Big Bang theory is now accepted by practically all scientists as the key that has the answer to the mystery of life. There is almost universal agreement about it. Basically, the Big Bang theory tells the amazing story of how the universe began, with every speck of its energy jammed into a tiny point. This extremely dense point exploded with unimaginable force, creating matter and propelling it outward to make the millions of galaxies of our vast universe. That is the accepted science and it makes sense to accept it because there is virtual universal agreement about it among the scientists.

But where did that vital point, whose explosion sparked off the whole scenario – where did that point come from? Science does not have an answer to this question. Scientists looking at the natural world and examining the evolution of all living things and the evolution of the whole universe itself have come to a stage beyond which they are failing to give any answers. They are failing to explain that 'Extremely Dense Point', which existed approximately 13.7 billion years ago. How did that point come about? Who or what made it? The response of the majority of scientists to that question is – 'We don't know'.

At this stage we turn to the second book, which tells us about the mystery of life. The first book, the book of the natural world – is complemented by the Bible – the Word of God. God is revealed in his works and in the Word of Life. In the beginning was the Word. In the First Letter of St Paul to the Colossians, we read: 'Christ is the image of the invisible God, the first-born over-all creation. For in him all things were created: things in the heaven and things on earth, visible and invisible... all things have been created, through him and for him. He is before all things, and, in him all things hold together. (1:15-18) The Christ of all Creation existed before all that exists. Christ is the image of the invisible God, the first born of all creation. Jesus the person who walked this earth two thousand years ago is the Christ of all creation. That is why we celebrate' Christ the King'. 'Not one thing came into being except through him' (John1:3)
